Emphasis within verses added by me. Do not disregard the rest of the verse, chapter, book, or whole Bible. Hold this list accountable and view each verse in the context of the sum of God's Word.

Green text is what I added when I was looking over this topic. It is not scripture. You are welcome to read it but I encourage you to form your own beliefs based on the verses alone.

When opening scripture, I encourage you to always say a prayer to ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in truth, remove your possible bias, and show you what God wants you to know instead of simply showing you what you want to see.

1. Matthew 3:6

Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

2. Matthew 3:11

"I **<u>baptize you with water for repentance</u>**. But after me will come one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not fit to carry. He will _. John: Baptize -> Repentance Jesus: Baptism -> Holy Spirit and Fire

3. Matthew 3:13

[The Baptism of Jesus] Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be **baptized** by John.

4. Matthew 3:14

But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be **baptized** by you, and do you come to me?"

5. Matthew 3:16

As soon as Jesus was **baptized**, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting on him.

Jesus was baptized and Spirit of God settled on Him.

6. Matthew 20:22-23

²² But Jesus answered, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink [of, and to be **baptized** with the baptism that I am baptized with - **KJV only**]?" They *said to Him, "We are able." Bracketed part is not in all versions.

7. Matthew 28:19

Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, **<u>baptizing them in the</u>** <u>name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit</u>,

Baptizing in the name of...

8. Mark 1:4-5

John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness preaching a **baptism** of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were **baptized** by him in the Jordan River.

John the Baptist: Confess -> Baptized -> of repentance for the forgiveness of sin

9. Mark 1:8-9

I **<u>baptize you with water</u>**, but he will **<u>baptize you with the Holy Spirit</u>**." At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was **baptized** by John in the Jordan.

John: Baptize -> Repentance Jesus: Baptism -> Holy Spirit

10. Mark 6:14

And King Herod heard *of it*, for His name had become well known; and *people* were saying, "John the **Baptist** has risen from the dead, and that is why these miraculous powers are at work in Him."

11. Mark 7:4

and *when they come* from the market place, they do not eat unless they **cleanse** themselves; and there are many other things which they have received in order to observe, such as the washing of cups and pitchers and copper pots.)

12. <u>Mark 10:38</u>

"You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be **baptized** with the **baptism** I am **baptized** with?" Death and resurrection?

13. Mark 10:39

"We can," they answered. Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be **baptized** with the **baptism** I am baptized with, Jesus says they will

14. Mark 16:16

Whoever **believes and is baptized will be saved**, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. Belief leads to baptism so he doesn't need to say if you aren't also baptized..

15. Luke 3:7

John said to the crowds coming out to be **baptized** by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? baptism is a part of fleeing wrath

16. Luke 3:12

Tax collectors also came to be **baptized**. "Teacher," they asked, "what should we do?"

Baptized led to 'what should we do', baptism is a new birth and way of living

17. Luke 3:16

John answered them all, "I **<u>baptize you with water</u>**. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. **<u>He will</u> <u>baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire</u>**.

John: Baptize -> Repentance Jesus: Baptism -> Holy Spirit and Fire

18. Luke 3:21

[The Baptism and Genealogy of Jesus] When all the people were being **baptized**, Jesus was **baptized** too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened All the people baptized, Jesus baptized

19. <u>Luke 7:29</u>

(All the people, even the tax collectors, when they heard Jesus' words, acknowledged that God's way was right, because they had been **baptized** by John.

20. <u>Luke 7:30</u>

But the Pharisees and experts in the law rejected God's purpose for themselves, because they had not been **baptized** by John.)

21. Luke 11:38

When the Pharisee saw it, he was surprised that He had not first ceremonially washed before the meal. [baptized]

22. Luke 12:50

But I have a **baptism** to undergo, and how distressed I am until it is accomplished!

23. John 1:25

questioned him, "Why then do you **baptize** if you are not the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"

24. **John 1:26**

"I **baptize with water**," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know.

25. **John 1:28**

These things took place in Bethany beyond the Jordan, where John was **baptizing**.

26. **John 1:31**

I did not recognize Him, but so that He might be manifested to Israel, I came *baptizing in water*."

27. John 1:33

I would not have known him, except that the one who sent me to **<u>baptize with</u>** <u>water</u> told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is he who will <u>**baptize with the Holy Spirit**</u>.' (*but Jesus didn't baptize John 4:2*) Jesus baptized -> Spirit remained on Him

28. **John 3:22**

[John the Baptist's Testimony About Jesus] After this, Jesus and his disciples went out into the Judean countryside, where He spent some time with them, and **baptized**.

In context many were coming to Jesus and were being baptized. So many that John the Baptists followers were concerned. John 3:26.

29. **John 3:23**

Now John also was **baptizing** at Aenon near Salim, <u>because there was plenty</u> <u>of water, and people were constantly coming to be baptized</u>. 'Because there was plenty of water' doesn't sound like sprinkling works

30. **John 3:26**

And they came to John and said to him, "Rabbi, He who was with you beyond the Jordan, to whom you have testified, behold, He is **baptizing** and all are coming to Him."

31 **John 4:1**

Therefore when the Lord knew that the Pharisees had heard that **Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples** than John

Making AND baptizing disciples. It could be argued that baptism is part of discipleship OR that even disciples (followers) needed to be baptized. Either way you read it, baptism was part of the process required.

32. **John 4:2**

although in fact it was not Jesus who **baptized**, but his disciples. Jesus did not baptize. He elsewhere said he doesn't come to baptize.

33. **John 10:40**

And He went away again beyond the Jordan to the place where John was first **baptizing**, and He was staying there.

33. <u>Acts 1:5</u>

For John **baptized** with water, but in a few days you will be **baptized** with the Holy Spirit."

John -> Water (not Holy Spirit)

34. <u>Acts 2:38</u>

Peter replied, "*Repent and be baptized*, every one of you, *in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins*. *And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit*.

Repent AND be baptized EVERY one of you, (baptized) in the name of Jesus Christ (baptized) FOR forgiveness of your sins AND you will receive Holy Spirit.

35. <u>Acts 2:41</u>

Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. Accepted message -> Baptized.

36. <u>Acts 8:12</u>

But <u>when they believed Philip as he preached the good news of the</u> <u>kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized</u>, both men and women.

When they believed they were baptized.

37. <u>Acts 8:13</u>

Simon himself **believed and was baptized**. And he followed Philip everywhere, astonished by the great signs and miracles he saw. Believed and was baptized.

38. <u>Acts 8:16</u>

because the Holy Spirit had not yet come upon any of them; they had simply been *baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus*.

Had not received Holy Spirit.

John 7:39 Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

John 16:7 Jesus has to go so He can send the Helper.

Opposite of Acts 10:47 where they received the Spirit by laying on of hands but had not been baptized.

39. <u>Acts 8:36</u>

As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, *here is water*. *Why shouldn't I be baptized*?"

Water -> Baptized (urgency). They probably had drinking water with them. Why not just sprinkle him?

40. **Acts 8:38**

And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both <u>Philip and the eunuch</u> <u>went down into the water and Philip baptized him</u>.

Went down into the water -> baptized

41. **Acts 9:18**

Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. *He got up and was baptized*,

Regained sight -> Baptized. Saul had just had a conversation with Jesus and a name change, but still didn't receive the Spirit? Because he needed to be baptized into Christ.

42. <u>Acts 10:47</u>

Then Peter said, "Can anyone keep these people from being **<u>baptized with</u>** <u>water</u>? They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have." Already had Spirit, baptism still required. There is a difference between indwelling of the Spirit (guide, and pledge) which can only be done in baptism, and the laying on of the Spirit which can give gifts that glorify God.

43. <u>Acts 10:48</u>

So he ordered that they be **<u>baptized in the name of Jesus Christ</u>**. Then they asked Peter to stay with them for a few days. Ordered baptism in the name of Jesus Christ

44. <u>Acts 11:16</u>

Then I remembered what the Lord had said: 'John **baptized** with water, but you will be **baptized** with the Holy Spirit.'

45. **Acts 16:15**

When she and the members of her household were **baptized**, she invited us to her home. "If you consider me a believer in the Lord," she said, "come and stay at my house." And she persuaded us.

She and the members of her household were baptized. She called on their witness of her belief (belief is action, baptism) to entreat them to come to her house.

46. <u>Acts 16:33</u>

At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then **immediately he and all his family were baptized**.

Immediately he and family were baptized. If sprinkling is sufficient weren't they baptized while they washed wounds?

47. <u>Acts 18:8</u>

Crispus, the synagogue ruler, and his entire household believed in the Lord; and many of the Corinthians who heard him *believed and were baptized*. Believed and were baptized. It does not say many believe and some were baptized. Belief leads to baptism and can not be separated.

48. Acts 19:3-5

And he said, "Into what then were you **baptized**?" And they said, "Into John's **baptism**." ⁴ Paul said, "John **baptized** with the <u>baptism of repentance</u>, telling the people to believe in Him who was coming after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵ On hearing this, they were <u>baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus</u>. Baptism of repentance wasn't sufficient; the baptism must be to put reliance on Jesus to save.

49. <u>Acts 22:16</u>

And now *what are you waiting for*? Get up, *be baptized and wash your sins away*, calling on his name.' What are you waiting for? -> urgency Get up -> one must be standing or go somewhere to receive the Spirit if it is simply baptism OF the Holy Spirit? Baptized -> wash away sins

NOTE: From here on out something changes. Baptism after the book of Acts is always a reminder that they have been baptized or more on what baptism means. Why? Because the books after Acts are letter to the churches. Why would the churches need to be told to be baptized? They were baptized into the church.

50. **Romans 6:3**

Or don't you know that all of us who were **baptized** into Christ Jesus were **baptized** into his death? Baptized into Christ -> baptized into His death.

51. 1 Corinthians 1:13

Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Were you **baptized** into the name of Paul?

Is Christ divided? Those in Christ are baptized in the name of Jesus and not Paul.

52. 1 Corinthians 1:14

I am thankful that I did not **baptize** any of you except Crispus and Gaius, Talking to saved. They are baptized but not by Paul.

53. 1 Corinthians 1:15

so no one can say that you were **baptized** into my name. Talking to saved. They are baptized but not by Paul.

5. **<u>1 Corinthians 1:16</u>**

(Yes, I also baptized the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I don't remember if I **baptized** anyone else.)

55. 1 Corinthians 1:17

For Christ did not send me to **baptize**, but to preach the gospel-not with words of human wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power. Paul was not sent to baptize but to preach the gospel, he is not responsible for their obedience

56. **<u>1 Corinthians 10:2</u>**

They were all **<u>baptized into Moses</u>** in the cloud and in the sea. Red Sea on both sides, cloud above, they were 'immersed'. They were saved by their faith in God and Moses as their leader.

57. 1 Corinthians 12:13

For we were all **baptized by one Spirit into one body** - whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free-and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. An analogy ALL baptized (not some). Were baptized by one Spirit AND were all given the one Spirit to drink. If baptism was 'baptism of they Holy Spirit' and not water baptism why would we be drinking of the Spirit that just was our baptism? The Spirit does the work when we are baptized.

58. **<u>1 Corinthians 15:29</u>**

Now if there is no resurrection, what will those do who are **baptized** for the dead? If the dead are not raised at all, why are people **baptized** for them? Confusing verse. I believe it means people were motivated to be baptized to see those who already died.

59. Galatians 3:27

for all of you who were *baptized into Christ* have clothed yourselves with Christ.

Baptized -> Clothed yourself with Christ

60. Ephesians 4:4-5

⁴ There is one body and one Spirit, just as you also were called in one hope of your calling; ⁵ one Lord, one faith, <u>one baptism</u>, One baptism -> Not water baptism and Spirit baptism

61. Colossians 2:12

¹² having been <u>buried with Him in baptism</u>, in which you were also raised with Him <u>through faith in the working of God</u>, who raised Him from the dead.

Is baptism a work? YES! But God does the work.

62. I Peter 3:18-21

¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all *time, the* just for *the* unjust, so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit; ¹⁹ in which He also went and made proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰ who once were disobedient when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were <u>brought safely through the water</u>. ²¹ Corresponding to that, <u>baptism now saves you</u>—not the removal of dirt from the flesh, but <u>an appeal to God for a good conscience</u> — through the resurrection of Jesus Christ,
